In Retrospect ...

The Physical Education Department opened its doors in September 1953. The facilities at that time consisted of a swimming pool, two exercise rooms, four gym mats and four footballs! The staff of the department consisted of Miss Aletha Emerick, in charge of girls' physical education and Mr. William Thornton, in charge of boys' physical education, in charge of boys' physical education.

In its first years the Physical Education Department worked only with the boys and girls of Middle and Upper School. As the enrollment of CSDR increased the Physical Education Department started classes for the children in Lower School. These classes were under the direction of Mrs. Ann Rush and Mr. Robert Lennan. In 1958 Mrs. Ann Rush became an academic teacher in Middle School and was replaced by Miss Rita Gesue. She was replaced in 1960 by Mrs. Vernice Convery. Mr. Robert Lennan became an academic teacher in 1961 and was replaced by Mrs. Peter Lanzi, former pro football player with the Detroit Lions and High School football coach in Youngstown, Ohio.

From its meager beginning the Physical Education Department now boasts a beautiful gymnasium, football field, baseball field, track, soccer field, three hard court areas plus all of the necessary equipment.


Both boys and girls in High School and Junior High School participate in interscholastic and intramural activities.



Summary of the Season

CSDR ended the 1962 football season in a tie for third place in the Arrowhead League. Although the Cubs started out well in the beginning of the season, they lost three of their last four games to end with a season total of 3 wins and 4 losses.

The statistics for the season show that our boys were ahead of the opponents in most phases of the games. They also indictate the chief reason why our team was behind in points scored—fumbles. The team fumbled 21 times for an average of 3 fumbles per game. Offensively CSDR completed 41 passes out of 57 while limiting the opponents to a mere 37 completions out of 94 attempts.

The boys have improved on both offense and defense. Although many of our first string players will be leaving this year, we expect to have a strong team next year.
