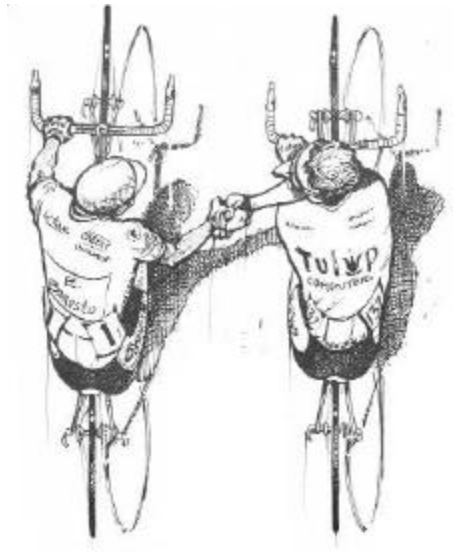

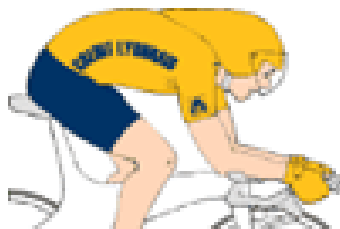

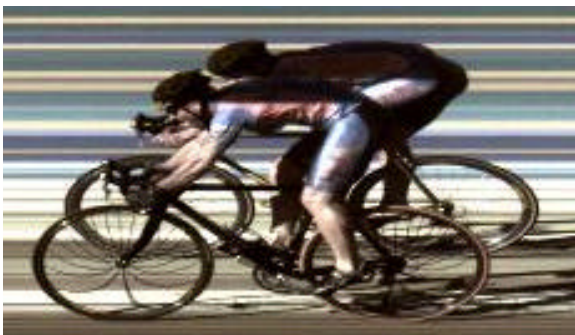

A full day of heat races did not tire out Trevor Kosa (USA) as he sprinted away from his teammate to capture the gold by the finish photo. He credited his endurance and speed in overtaking Paul Wood (USA) in the final 200 meters.

Bobby Skedsmo, CISS Technical Director announced the winner at the podium with assistance of Paulus Gottfried, German cycling coach who was the EDSO Cycling Technical Director.

Two days later, Paul Wood responded to Trevor Kosa's gold with a gold of his own in the points race.



100 KM ROAD RACE FINALISTS

Josef Merunka (CZE) - Bernard Barugola (FRA) - Roberto Malacarne (ITA)



Bernard Barugola (FRA) edged Czech Republic Josef Menunka by 1/100 to capture gold in the 100 kilometer road race with 2:07.42. The grueling race saw the early morning temperature quickly escalate by 15 degree and the pool of riders drop from 24 to 14.



35 KM TIME TRIAL FINALISTS

As expected Gerald Mielke-Weyel (GER) would be a winner but was waiting for official result while Nick Schreiber (USA) was questioning himself whether he might be the winner but only found that it was 2 minutes apart. At the far right, Bruno Garroni of Local Organizing Committee for cycling is checking for official result for them. The third place at the podium was exchanged after the technical committee determined that the other rider used "illegal" bike for the competition.
